


## Newsletter 20/01/2018

Vi is going to Nkhata Bay which is in the Northern part of Malawi and Ida is going to the Island of Likoma which is in Lake Malawi. They are on separate teams. They will be finished their DTS near the end of March.

The church we started, Likwakwanda Community Church, is going well. We have now finished our 1st year of operation. As many do not have bibles and we were given the book of Mark in chichewa we had been teaching from that book over the last year. Now we have produced and printed the books of John and Romans also in chichewa.



Here is where we had hoped to start our church building this past week but because of rain we will now start on Monday. We are going to start off with building pillars and a roof. Then we will put a wall on the front and then half walls along the sides leaving the back open for expansion.





We have bought 30 bags of cement and the rebar that you see here for the pillars. We are praying that we have enough money to build the 6 pillars. We currently have about 725\$ so we should be close. The costly part will be the roof. It will cost about 2500\$ to put the roof on and

about another \$1200 to do the walls and floor. If you feel to partner with us in building this church it would be more then appreciated.

We are feeling that the Lord would have us return to Canada in May - June for a few weeks this year. The fall didn't turn out to good for us and this year we will busy most of the fall. It just seems that the spring is a better time for us. So helps us pray about this as we seek to get the heart of the Lord on this matter.
